August Preachers: At the eleven o'clock service on August 1st, the preacher at the Church of the Redeemer will be the Rt. Rev. Frank Woods, M.A., bishop-suffragan of Middleton in the Diocese of Manchester (Church of England). Bishop Woods is in this country to attend the Anglican Congress and comes to us with the reputation of being a fine preacher. On the last three Sundays in July he preached at St. Thomas' in New York City, the First Reformed Church in Schenectady and the Cathedral Church of St. John in Wilmington. On August 15th he will preach at the Second Presbyterian Church in Baltimore.

On August 8th Canon Earp will be the preacher at the 11:00 o'clock service.

On August 15th we expect to have as our preacher the Rev. John Stow, Archdeacon of Bermuda and Rector of St. George's Parish. He will be in Bryn Mawr for a day or two on his return trip from attending the Anglican Congress as delegate from Bermuda. Mr. Stow is the son-in-law of Canon and Mrs. Earp and is well-known in Philadelphia. He was for four years chaplain on H. M. S. Sovereign, which was in Philadelphia for repairs for about a year during World War II. He has preached at the Church of the Redeemer before and has also served as supply minister at St. Martin's, Radnor and Old Swedes, Philadelphia.

Church Meetings in August: During this month two Christian gatherings of international scope will take place in the middle west. The second meeting of the Anglican Congress will be held in Minneapolis August 4-13. It will be attended by delegates from almost all the dioceses of the Episcopal Church in this country and abroad and by delegates from the other dioceses of the Anglican Communion around the world. The second assembly of the World Council of Churches will meet at Evanston August 14-31. The proceedings at both meetings will undoubtedly receive extensive coverage in both the secular and church press and the Rector hopes that members of the congregation will follow them with interest.

Mr. Edward P. Bromley, chairman of the Every Member Canvass for 1955, has reported to the Vestry that Messrs. Wm. Farrow, Jr., LeRoy Goff and Springer Moore have accepted his invitation to serve as vice-chairmen for the Canvass. This will give us a strong team and maintains what seems to the Rector a quite remarkable record. During the five years that the Canvass has been conducted only one man has declined to serve in a top position and that was for compelling reasons of health.

Summer Office Hours: During August the parish office is open from 9:00 to 4:00 Monday through Thursday and 9:00 to 12:00 on Fridays. The office will not be open on Saturdays.

Weekday Services: As noted in the July Bulletin, the Wednesday morning communion service will be discontinued for August. The regular Thursday morning communion services will be held as usual.

The 9:30 Service has been discontinued for the summer months and will be resumed in September.
